SOFTWARE, HARDWARE & LEARNING RESOURCES

Audacity: Audacity is an audio editing software application that can be downloaded for free from http://audacity.sourceforge.net/download/. Audacity will be used for completing various assignments and projects in this course.

Adobe Premiere: Adobe Premiere Elements 13 is a video editing software application and will be used for completing various assignments and projects in this course. Adobe Premiere Elements can be purchased and downloaded from Adobe.com for approximately \$99. You may be able to find downloads of the software that are less expensive from Amazon.com. Note: If you choose to download the software from Amazon, be aware that the legitimacy of the software is dependent on the legitimacy of the vendor who is selling the software.

Important Note: You do not have to use, download, or purchase Audacity & Adobe Premiere to complete this course. You may use an application that you have access to and/or are already familiar with. Please be aware that the majority of the course Modules, Assignments, Tutorials, and Projects are based around the software applications mentioned above. If you do not use Audacity and Adobe Premiere, you will be responsible for learning the skills necessary to complete the requirements of the course using the software you have chosen to work with.

Cameras: You will be required to provide your own video camera for this course. A video camera on a smart phone will be more than adequate to complete the Assignments and Projects for this course. If you are interested in borrowing a video camera, contact me and we can work out the arrangements for checking out and borrowing equipment.

Microphones: While it is suggested that you use an *external mic* (e.g. USB, Bluetooth), you can also use a recording/dictation app from a smart phone or the *built in mic* in your computer's operating system. If you are interested in borrowing an external microphone, contact me and we can work out the arrangements for checking out and borrowing equipment.

Laulima: Laulima is an online course management system and will be used to post the Course Schedule, Assignments, Discussions, Projects, Modules, Announcements, and any relevant information pertaining to the class. https://laulima.hawaii.edu/portal Please check the Laulima Announcements regularly to make sure you are keeping up with the pace of the course and are aware of any upcoming deadlines.
