
- 1. provide students with a large-scale analysis of human development and change over time.

- 6. engage students in the study and analysis of writings, narratives, texts, artifacts, and/or practices that represent the perspectives of different societies and cultural traditions.

- 4. Explain cause and effect relationships in history.
- 5. Compare and contrast historical experiences across cultures and time.
- 6. Relate historical events to contemporary issues and events.



METHOD OF INSTRUCTION: ONLINE

Ask yourself if online is the right method of instruction for you. If you are very independent, organized, focused, and techsavy, you should do fine in an online course. On the other hand, if these traits do not describe you, please seriously consider taking a traditional (face-to-face (F2F)) class.

- This course will expect that you are able to independently read, comprehend the "facts" on your own, complete the assignments, and navigate through Laulima with little guidance.
- Keeping on track is a must in this class. Always refer to the Class Schedule that starts on page 8 of this syllabus. EVERY WEEK (other than during the week reserved for Exam #1 and the week reserved for Exam #2) you will be expected to read 1—2 chapters in the textbook, go through the corresponding PowerPoint Lessons, and complete the corresponding assignments which includes quizzes, Relevancy Question Assignments, Discussion Posts, etc.) as scheduled in the class schedule. If this sounds overwhelming, then please drop the class and take another class.
- Check ANNOUNCEMENTS on the Main Page in Laulima for any announcements pertaining to our class. Every Monday morning, I will post an Announcement introducing the Week's Topics & Assignments. I will also post other Announcements throughout the Week, sometimes the Announcements will highlight student work (i.e., summaries, conclusions, thoughtful insights &/or well-written statements) reached in discussions and other assignments and remind you of due dates.

- ❖ You should check your UH email account frequently (you are required to use your UH hawaii.edu email account; however, you can have your mail from this account forwarded to an email account that you more frequently use).
- Make sure you adhere to the due dates to avoid the late penalty that is assessed for all late work. Note that you will have assignments that are either due online in Laulima OR by email (see Class Schedule for reference). Furthermore, Exam #1 and Exam #2 MUST be taken during their scheduled times, unless you made prior arrangements with me or had a valid emergency and contacted me in a timely manner. You will only have a 96-hour period (Week #9's Thursday through Sunday for Exam #1 and Finals Week's Monday through Thursday for Exam #2) to take the exams. Plan now for the exams! If you find that you will not be able to take the exams during their designated testing period, then you must drop the class, unless you made arrangements with me PRIOR to the testing period. No exceptions to this policy will be granted unless you had an extenuating circumstance (i.e., valid illness or emergency). The good news is that you can take the exams from anywhere in the world as long as you have an Internet (preferably a high-speed) connection. Furthermore, I trust that when you do take your exams, that you are taking the exams by yourself and utilizing only the class resources (i.e., textbook, stuff in our Laulima site, any article links I give you, etc.) that you have. Accordingly, I will then be grading your exam answers based on the required resources for this class.
- In general, grading & releasing of Laulima assignments (i.e., quizzes & assignments) and grades for Discussions input into Laulima's Gradebook will occur approximately 3—5 days after the due date if not sooner. One thing to keep in mind when checking your grade in Laulima's Gradebook is that if you are missing certain Laulima assignments, the grade that appears for you may be incorrect as I will not input zeroes for missed quizzes & assignments until our term is over since you have until Thursday, 12/15 @ 11:59pm to turn these in and if I input a zero prior to you completing the assignment(s), Laulima may not allow you to complete the assignment(s).
- Make sure you adhere to the due dates to avoid the late penalty after the 48-hour grace period that is assessed for certain late work (i.e., quizzes & certain assignments) turned in after their due dates. COURSE TASKS

Welcome to the wonderful world of history—where we will make the past come to life as we explore the histories of the various peoples of the world in order to become better informed citizens and make our modern, global world more meaningful! As we look into the past, it may be helpful to view history as a movie—full of characters, with some playing significant roles and others playing supporting ones, drama, and significant events. Together, then, we will analyze this movie called history, highlighting the important individuals, concepts/ideas, places, societies, events, and all the drama that went along with this. As we explore the drama of the past, the class will focus on the **development of diverse cultures**, **similarities & differences** between these cultures, and the **connections** & **conflicts** that have arisen between these cultures.

The class will be centered around the following course tasks, that serve as both learning and assessment tools, for the purpose of measuring your learning and your ability to meet the course SLOs.

✓ Take <u>2</u> Exams. Each Exam is worth 100 points total. The purpose of these exams is to assess both your critical thinking and comprehension of the material covered in class up to the moment of the exam. Exams will consist of a mixture of multiple choice, short written answer question (write 3—5 complete sentences) &/or essay. All exams are completed AT-HOME in the "Exams" icon in Laulima and have a time limit of 2

hours. Study Guides for both exams will be made available approximately 2 weeks prior to the exam and will be found in the "Study Guides for Exams" folder found in the Resources icon.

- Exams are to be taken when scheduled. Make-up exams will only be given in cases of illness (with a doctor's note) or valid emergency. If you are unable to take the scheduled exam, I expect you or a family member to immediately contact me before or on the day of the scheduled exam. No make-up exam will be scheduled without you contacting me in a timely manner.
- ✓ Complete the Real World Scenario: The Freedom & Security Challenge Assignment. This cumulative assignment is worth 100 points total and will be due by or on Sunday, December 11, 2016 @ 11:59pm by EMAIL only as either a Word Doc, Google Doc, PDF or YouTube link only. Be sure to check for EMAIL confirmation in 24 hours of when you first emailed this assignment to me to make sure that I received it; if you do NOT receive an email confirmation from me, that means I did not receive it and you need to resend. The premise of this assignment comes from the belief that if we want to create a better future for ourselves, then we must be informed citizens that can draw upon past experiences to predict what ramifications our decisions today can have for the future.
 - For this assignment, you will need to come up with a proposal of <u>no more than 1250 words that is typed (if written) and follows all grammatical & mechanical rules or no more than 5 minutes if a <u>video</u> that advises the leaders of the U.S. on how they can best combat the terrorist threat to our nation without sacrificing the freedoms we enjoy by drawing upon historical examples of what past societies did to secure their own countries. In order to do this, you must to utilize historical examples of what past societies did to secure their own societies & assess if how they secured or failed to secure their respective societies led to their collapse by referencing <u>all</u> of the following societies:</u>
 - 1. The Assyrian Empire
 - 2. The Mauryan Empire
 - 3. The Qin Dynasty of China
 - 4. The Persian Empire
 - 5. Sparta
 - 6. Athens
 - 7. The Roman Empire
 - 8. The Carolingian Empire
 - 9. The Mongol Empire
 - b. Furthermore, you will need to cite specific primary source evidence in your written proposal from <u>all</u> of the following primary sources:
 - 1. The Assyrian Military Machine (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 2. Sun Tzu, *The Art of War* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 3. Sima Qian, *The Legalist Policies of the Qin* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 4. Herodotus, *Xerxes Invades Greece* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 5. Thucydides, *Pericles Funeral Oration* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 6. Tacitus, *On Corruption in the Early Roman Empire* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 7. Tacitus, *The Rebellion of Boudicca* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 8. Einhard, *Life of Charlemagne* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - 9. Marco Polo, *Accounts of Western Asia* (found in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Primary Source Readings Folder" folder)
 - c. Note that while the guidelines for this assignment says to create a written proposal, it does not mean you need to write an essay. It is thus up to you what type of written format you want this assignment to be in and thus, please feel free to be creative! If you want to create a video, a comic strip, a Google Presentation, a poem or so forth please do so!

- d. The Real World Scenario is due by or on <u>Sunday, 12/11 @ 11:59pm by EMAIL either as a Word Doc, Google Doc, PDF or YouTube link only</u>. After the 48-hour grace period, a 20% late penalty will be deducted for turning in this assignment after the due date.
- ✓ Take 10 Reading Reveal Quizzes which are found in the "Exams" icon in our class Laulima site. Each quiz will consist of 5 multiple choice questions and you will have 15 minutes to complete the quiz. Quizzes will be on the assigned readings & Lessons for the topic unit(s) in order to assess your comprehension of the assigned readings. Note that for some weeks, you may not have a Reading Reveal Quiz scheduled; however, the following week will then have a Reading Reveal Quiz that combines the topic units from two weeks. You will be granted access to all quizzes at the beginning of the term, but each quiz must be completed by its specified due date in the syllabus which will always be on a Sunday by 11:59pm. Please note that late quizzes will continue to be accepted in Laulima until Thursday, 12/15 @ 11:59pm; however, all quizzes completed after the due date will be assessed a late penalty of 2 points after the 48-hour grace period. Each quiz is worth up to 10 points possible.
- Take 5 Documentary Quizzes which are found in the "Exams" icon in our class Laulima site. Each quiz will consist of 5 multiple choice questions &/or True or False questions and you will have 15 minutes to complete the quiz. Quizzes will be on the specific documentaries in order to assess your comprehension of the assigned documentaries. Note that as you watch these documentaries (which are accessed in the homepage of our class Laulima site by scrolling down the left side column until you find the links), you should answer the questions on the Documentary Quiz Questions Study Guides provided in the "Resources" icon in our class Laulima site, then click on the "Documentary Quiz Questions Study Guides" to access. This way, as you watch the documentary, you will be filling out a "study guide" that will help you when you complete the Documentary Quiz. Note that you will be granted access to all quizzes at the beginning of the term, but each quiz must be completed by its specified due date in the syllabus which will always be on a Sunday by 11:59pm. Please note that late quizzes will continue to be accepted in Laulima until Thursday, 12/15 @ 11:59pm; however, all quizzes completed after the due date will be assessed a late penalty of 2 points after the 48-hour grace period. Each quiz is worth up to 10 points possible.
- ✓ Participate in ALL 6 Relevancy Question Assignments found in the "Relevancy Question Assignments" icon in our class Laulima site. Each assignment is up to worth 2 points total and will ask you 1-2 questions that will engage you with the Topic Unit assigned for the Week. Questions will thus make you ponder modern-day questions that have a basis & relevancy in what you will learn about in history. I will also share some of your answers from the Week's Relevancy Question Assignment in an Announcement posted on Wednesdays as a method of collaborative learning so that we can learn and gain insight from one another.
 - o Relevancy Question Assignments will always be **due on or by Wednesday @ 12:00pm** for the Week in which assigned. Also, since I will be using your answers to create an Announcement of student insights, summaries, &/or conclusions to send out later in the day on Wednesday, no late Relevancy Question Assignments will be accepted regardless of reason. Since you will have access to all Relevancy Question Assignments at the beginning of the semester, you may want to complete them in advance as the questions deal with your thoughts on hypothetical questions &/or current issues and no prior knowledge of historical topics is required.
- ✓ Participate in 4 Share & Tell Discussions found in the "Discussion Board" icon in our class Laulima site (click on "Discussion Board" icon in Laulima to access). Refer to the class schedule to see assigned Discussion for the week. Discussions will be graded on how well you follow the guidelines listed below (note that the Discussions only allow you to REPLY to the post that I have set up):
 - The instructions will be this: in your reply, please 1) answer the question that I post in 3—5 complete sentences, and 2) respond to the student's response that directly precedes your reply with 1—3 complete sentences. In other words, if you are the first student to reply to this post, then you are to 1) answer the question, and 2) reply to what I write about. Another example is if you are the 10th student to reply, then you will be 1) answering the question that I post below, and 2) replying to the reply of the 9th student. If you have any questions about this, please email me.
 - Your <u>answer</u> to the question that I post should consist of 3—5 complete sentences that are ORIGINAL in thought (and not just a paraphrase of the comments that preceded it).

- Your <u>response</u> to the student's response that directly precedes yours should consist of 1—3 complete sentences of <u>why</u> you agree or disagree with this student's response. In other words, don't just say you agree or disagree. Always <u>explain</u> your position (i.e., what you found thoughtful, insightful, etc. about the previous student's response).
- For these Discussions, each Post that answers the question I posted is worth up to 3 points, and your reply to student post directly preceding your post is worth up to 2 points for a total of 5 points for each of these Discussions.
- The Share & Tell Discussion Post for the week will always be due on the Sunday by 11:59pm of the week in which it was assigned. Due to the collaborate & interactive nature of Share & Tell Discussions, no late Discussion Posts will be accepted, regardless of reason. If you are unable to post in the Discussion Board, please EMAIL me what you would have posted in the Discussion by the deadline. ACCESS to the Discussion will be LIMITED to Monday through Sunday for the week that it is assigned (EXCEPT for Week One's Share & Tell Discussion #1 which will be open for 2 weeks since students have through the 2nd week of the term to still register for classes).
- o In general, always remember the following Discussion Board Rules:
 - Always be mindful that you are RESPECTFUL of what your classmates have to say. Negative comments will NOT be tolerated and will result in either the removal or editing of negative posts. Please note that one of WCC's core values is Ho'ihi (Respect). This includes cultural awareness & aloha, student voice, 'ohana-style inclusiveness, and LGBTI Safe Zones. Discussion forums will NOT be used to discriminate against or put down your fellow students or other cultures & religions. - Participate in ALL <u>9</u> Discussion Threads for the Socratic Discussion on Freedom & Security found in the "Discussion Board" icon in our class Laulima site (click on "Discussion Board" icon in Laulima to access). Refer to the class schedule to see assigned Discussion Thread for the Week. These Discussion Threads will help to prepare you for the Real World Scenario: Freedom & Security Challenge Assignment as the Discussion Threads will help to define the terms of "Freedom" and "Security" and how these concepts were utilized in past societies as evidenced by the specified primary sources that you will need to read & evidence for the Real World Scenario: Freedom & Security Challenge Assignment. Discussions will be graded on how well you follow the guidelines listed below (note that the Discussions only allow you to REPLY to the post that I have set up):
 - The instructions for the Discussion Threads are the following: 1) read through all of the student responses prior to yours (if you are not the first to post), 2) answer the question(s) I post in 1-3 sentencing and note that if you realize that your answer is similar to that of one or more other students' answers, you will need to write a response that takes note of this similarity. For example, you should write something like "I agree with [insert student(s) name(s)] because ______.", and 3) be mindful of the Discussion Board Rules listed above in the Share & Tell Discussion Board as these rules also apply here.
 - The Discussion Thread for the week will always be due on the Sunday by 11:59pm of the week in which it was assigned. Due to the collaborate & interactive nature of the Discussion Thread, no late Discussion Posts will be accepted, regardless of reason. If you are unable to post in the Discussion Board, please EMAIL me what you would have posted in the Discussion by the deadline. ACCESS to the Discussion will be LIMITED to Monday through Sunday for the week that it is assigned. If you are unable to post in the Discussion Board, please EMAIL me what you would have posted in the Discussion by the deadline. Each Discussion Thread post is worth up to 2 points total.
