COURSE DESCRIPTION

Pacific Center for Environmental Studies (PaCES) Mentors-In-Training will meet on Saturdays (or weekdays after school) to receive instruction on laboratory and field procedures, use of instrumentation (including calibration procedures), and data summarization, presentation and analysis. This instruction will reinforce and enhance what they learned during the summer 2015 program.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

The student learning outcomes for the course are:

- Demonstrate proficiency in the calibration and use of environmental monitoring instrumentation and lab/field procedures to collect environmental data.
- Process and analyze environmental data.
- Demonstrate leadership in lab and field activities.

COURSE TASKS

The student will achieve these outcomes by participation in the following tasks:

- Meet regularly with instructor to calibrate and use environmental monitoring instrumentation (e.g., oxygen meter, salinometer, turbidimeter, pH meter, spectrophotometer, thermal cycler etc.) and lab/field procedures (e.g., water quality assessment, soil analyses, plankton quantification/identification, chlorophyll analysis, environmental microbiology, mapping, reef surveys, etc.) to collect environmental data.
- Use EXCEL, statistical software, and BLAST analyses to process, summarize, interpret and analyze data.

- Participate and help coordinate a community environmental restoration project.
- Complete an essay describing the student's participation in this program. This essay should include a self-assessment of the student's performance and learning outcomes.

GRADING

The assignment of points will be according to the following protocol:

Letter grades will assigned as follows:
