A survey of gods(akua), ‘aumakua, kupua, mythical heroes, heroins, and their kinolau as the basis of traditional Hawaiian metaphor.

NĀ HOPENA A‘O PILI I NĀ HAUMĀNA

Ma muli o ke komo ‘ana me ka ho‘okō pono ‘ana i nā koina ma ka hopena o kēia papa, e hiki ana i ka haumāna ke ho‘okō iho i kēia mau hopena o ke a‘o, i helu papa ‘ia ma lalo iho nei:

- E ho‘omaopopo, e ho‘okūkū a ho‘ohālikelike, i nā kumu mo‘o‘ōlelo o Hawai‘i nei mai nā kūpuna mai
- E ho‘omaopopo a kūka‘i ‘ike e pili ana i nā ‘ike nui ma nā mo‘o‘ōlelo Hawai‘i
- E ho‘omana‘o i nā mana‘o nui mai loko mai o nā mo‘o‘ōlelo Hawai‘i
- E ho‘omākaukau e ha‘i hou mai i kekahi mo‘o‘ōlelo Hawai‘i

NĀ HANA KŪPONO MA KA PAPA

Ua ho‘okahua ‘ia kēia papa ma ke ‘ano e kōkua aku a kōkua mai nā haumāna a pau me nā kumu kekahi me kekahi. He kuleana ko kēlā me kēia haumāna e ‘auamo i kona kuleana pono‘ī iho nona iho a no ka pono ho‘i o ka papa holo‘oko‘a, i papa hoihoi me ka nui o ke a‘o o nā po‘e a pau. ‘O kekahi lōina ko‘iko‘i nui, e ho‘ohana mau i ka ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i ma nā hana a pau. He papa kaiapuni Hawai‘i nō kēia! E na‘auao kākou ma o a i loko o ka ‘Ōlelo Hawai‘i (Kanaka) i ola pono maoli kākou a pau.

Pāpā ‘ia ka ho‘ohana ‘ia o nā mea uila pa‘alima, ‘o ia ho‘i, nā kelepona nā papa uila, mīkini ho‘onohonoho ‘ikena a pēlā wale aku o ia ‘ano mea aku. Mai lilo aku ‘oe ma ka wala‘au me kou hoa papa ma nā mea pili ‘ole i ka hana ma ka papa o pā i ka leo!

NĀ MEA KŌKUA MA KE A‘O ‘ANA MA KA PAPA

‘O nā mea heluhelu, nā ha‘awina, a me nā mea ‘ē aku i pili i kēia papa, e ho‘olako ‘ia nō ma ka papa. Na ke kumu a‘o/kumu kōkua e ho‘oloko pono aku iā ‘oukou i nā mea a‘o e pono ai ka papa ma ka ne‘ena o ka papa i loko o ke kau.

*E pono mau ana ka loa‘a o kāu puke kālana kākau e kākau ai i nā mana‘o a me nā mea i a‘o ‘ia ma ka papa. He pono nō ho‘i ka loa‘a o ka pepa laina no ka hana ‘ana i nā ha‘awina e hana a ho‘iho‘i mai i ke kumu. Pēia ho‘i me kāu peni a penikala paha no ke kākau ‘ana. (A i ‘ole kāu mīkini ho‘onohonoho ‘ikena e pono ai ma ka papa e mālama ‘ia ma o ka mīkini no ka papa.)

‘A‘ohe koina kū‘ai puke no kēia papa, akā na‘e, e ho‘ohana mau ‘ia ka puke; *Hawaiian Dictionary* na Samuel Elbert a me Mary Kawena Puku‘i. E ho‘olako ‘ia ana kēia mau pepa ma loko o ka papa.

NĀ HANA MA KĒIA PAPA

He ‘ehā mau māhele nui o nā hana ma kēia papa;

‘o ka mua, ‘o ka hiki kino ‘ana mai i ka papa me ka mākaukau e ku‘upau i kou no‘ono‘o piha ma nā hana e pono ai ke a‘o.

‘O ka ‘elua, ‘o ia nā hana ma loko o ka papa, ‘oia ho‘i, ke kākau mai i loko o ka puka kālana kākau me ke komo pū ma nā hana ma loko o ka manawa papa.

‘O ka ‘ekolu, ‘o ia nā ha‘awina e ho‘opa‘a ‘ia ma waho o ka papa a ho‘iho‘i mai ma kekahi papa mai.

‘O ka ‘ehā o nā māhele, ‘o ia nā hō‘ike; nā hō‘ike poko, me nā hō‘ike nui ‘elua, ‘o ke kūwaena a me ka hope loa. E kālele nui ‘ia ana nā māhele ma lalo iho nei:

NĀ LULA PILI I KA PAPA

No nā hō‘ike poko a me nui; ‘a‘ole e ‘ae ‘ia e hana ‘ia ma hope o ka wā kūpono i mālama ‘ia ai. Koe wale nō ka ‘ae mua ‘ana o ke kumu a‘o, a i ‘ole he pilikia kūkonukonu ma ke kino i hiki ‘ole ai iā ‘oe ke hiki kino mai i ka papa ma ia lā.

No nā ha‘awina kākau; e ‘ae ana ke kumu a‘o e hana i nā ha‘awina i hana ‘ole ‘ia ma ka wā kūpono a hā‘awi mai i ke kumu, ma mua o ka pule hope o ke kula me ke emi mai i ke kaha.
