STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

The student learning outcomes for the course:

- Identify orchid species, hybrids and trace their pedigrees.
- Provide cultural requirements for each genus, including temperature, light intensity, humidity, watering, fertilizing, media composition, pest/disease control and repotting.
- Perform traditional and *in vitro* propagations.

- Perform orchid breeding and discuss its economic importance.
- Conduct literature or experimental research and submit research paper.

COURSE TASKS

- Read and review assigned chapters in the textbooks and other lecture materials.
- Complete homework assignments, quizzes, and exams.
- Perform literature research for a topic presentation.

ASSESSMENT TASKS AND GRADING

- Quizzes/Assignments: Weekly quizzes/assignment will be given on the Laulima class site every Wednesday.
- Exams: there will be two exams (1 midterms and 1 final) during the semester. Exams will consist of multiple choices, true/false, fill in the blank, matching and short answer questions.
 - Make-up exam: will be permitted only by the instructor upon consideration of the evidence justifying the absence presented by the student.
- Orchid Care:
 - o Pick an orchid plant and take care of it through the semester;
 - o Give an oral presentation about the biology and cultivation of the orchid.
- A Field trip: choose one of the followings and submit a report.
 - o Attend a General Member Meeting organized by Honolulu Orchid Society.
 - Visit a community orchid show.
 - O Visit a local nursery: prepare and submit a report.

Grading
