CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course covers the nature and use of x-ray technology in veterinary technology. Students are also given an overview of alternative imaging techniques (ultrasound, CT scans, and digital radiography) as well as an introduction to the radiography of large animals and exotics. (3 hours lecture).

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of ANSC 252, the student will know how to:

- 1. Describe the uses and functioning of various types of medical imaging equipment.
- 2. Implement and observe recommended radiation safety measures.
- 3. Evaluate radiographic images for proper radiographic technique and patient positioning.
- 4. Explain the clinical uses of alternative imaging technologies.

COURSE TASKS

This course will be conducted in a Hybrid/Online Synchronous format. We will meet weekly to discuss the topics listed in the course schedule near the end of this syllabus. ANSC 252 is paired with a laboratory class where you will apply the knowledge learned in this course.

ASSESSMENT TASKS AND GRADING

WORKSHEETS: 30 points

There will be one worksheet to complete. This worksheet can be answered using the McCurnin's textbook and can be submitted via Laulima or in-person.

QUIZZES: 50 points

Quizzes will be proctored via Laulima. There are 5 quizzes total. <u>All quizzes must be submitted with an accompanying Loom recording to be valid for points.</u>

EXAM REVIEWS: 40 points

Students are expected to complete reviews prior to each exam. Each student will write 20 questions with the CORRECT answers from the chapters for the upcoming exam. Exam reviews must be submitted onto the designated Laulima page **and** Google Drive folder.

EXAMS: 150 points

There are two exams worth 50 and 100 points. The final exam is cumulative. <u>All exams must be submitted with an accompanying Loom recording to be valid for points.</u>
