- 5. Make judgments, solve problems, and reach decisions using analytical, critical, and creative thinking skills.

COURSE TASKS

Course work will consist of personal reflections, weekly assignments, emergency savings project, personal budgeting project, unit tests, questions of the day, FinCap Fridays, and final presentation.
