Course Information

Catalog Description

Differentiation and integration concepts of trigonometric, exponential, logarithmic and hyperbolic functions. Integration implements, infinite series, and applications of derivatives and integrals are also featured. (4 hours lecture)

Prerequisite(s): Grade of "C" or better in MATH 205 or MATH 241 or equivalent or consent of instructor.

- There are 3 computer-based quizzes. Each quiz is worth 50 points.
- There is one cumulative computer-based final exam worth 100 points due the last Friday of the term.
- The quizzes & final exam are timed, but not proctored and can be taken on any computer or device that runs MLM.
- For each quiz and exam, show work on paper or a tablet. Work will be uploaded to Lamakū. There is a 50% penalty for quizzes and exams submitted with no work.
- There is a review provided for each quiz and exam

MyLab Math (MLM) Homework

There are 26 computer-based homework assignments at 5 points each. Homework is due Fridays by 11:59 pm. There will be a 1% deduction per day for problems submitted after the due date. Final submission for late homework will be the Wednesday in the last week of class.

Forum Posts

There will be 7 posts due on (most) Fridays. Each post is worth 5 points.

Extra Credit

- Each quiz review is worth up to 5 points of extra credit.
- The final exam review is worth up to 5 points of extra credit.
- The end of semester student survey (CES) is worth 5 points of extra credit.
